Program Guidelines

Eligibility

Applicants to the UAW-Ford Rouge Powerhouse Memorial Scholarship Program must meet all of the following criteria:

- Dependent* children of full-time UAW-represented Ford employees who are active as of the application deadline date.
**Dependent children are defined as children who qualify as federal tax exemptions to the employee.*
- High school seniors or graduates who plan to enroll for the first time in full-time (12 credit hours) undergraduate study at an accredited two-year or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school for the entire upcoming academic year.
- Have a minimum 3.00 grade point average on a 4.00 scale (or the equivalent) during their last three semesters in high school prior to applying for this scholarship.

Awards

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive a \$1,000 award. Awards are one time only and are not renewable. Awards may be used for tuition and fees only.

Awards are for undergraduate study only.

Application

Interested students must complete the application and mail it along with a current, complete transcript of grades to Scholarship America postmarked no later than **May 15, 2019**. Grade reports are not acceptable.

Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. Applications are evaluated on the information supplied; therefore, answer all questions as completely as possible. Incomplete applications will not be evaluated. All information received is considered confidential and is reviewed only by Scholarship America.

Selection of Recipients

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unique personal or family circumstances, and an outside appraisal.

Selection of recipients is made by Scholarship America. In no instance does any officer or employee of the UAW or Ford Motor Company play a part in the selection. All applicants agree to accept the decision as final.

Applicants will be notified in mid-June. Not all applicants to the program will be selected as recipients.

Payment of Scholarships

Scholarship America processes UAW-Ford Rouge Powerhouse Memorial scholarship payments on behalf of the Ford Motor Company.

Obligations

Recipients have no obligation to the Ford Motor Company. They are, however, required to notify Scholarship America of any changes in address, school enrollment, or other relevant information and to send a complete transcript when requested.

Revisions

The Ford Motor Company reserves the right to review the conditions and procedures of this scholarship program and to make changes at any time including termination of the program.

The UAW-Ford Rouge Powerhouse Memorial Scholarship Fund is dedicated to the memory and spirit of six brave men who died on February 1, 1999, in a tragic explosion in the Powerhouse at the Ford Rouge Manufacturing Complex in Dearborn, Michigan. That their commitment and sacrifice to family and community may be remembered and their aspirations continued for generations, this scholarship program has been established in their honor.
