Rental <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • www.bookrenter.com • www.ecampus.com • www.valorebooks.com • www.neebe.com • www.campusbookrental.com 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Less expensive than purchasing new and sometimes less expensive than purchasing used • Most provided with pre-paid return labels 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unexpected fees and/or actual book purchase may be required if the book is returned damaged or is lost • Shipping/mailling costs may be incurred depending on the provider 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some stores limit rental books to the largest, most heavily attended courses, so there may not be books available for smaller or less popular courses. • Be sure the ISBN matches the desired book. Refunds for renting the wrong text are rare. • Read the fine print. Rental rates and time frames can vary widely.
eTextbooks <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • www.chegg.com • www.coursesmart.com • www.ecampus.com/etextbooks • University Library 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Considerably less expensive than hard copy • Easily portable and accessible on a number of devices • Eco-friendly: no paper consumed or waste produced 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DRM (Digital Rights Management) may limit access of texts to one or two devices • Access may have an expiration date • Printing of texts is usually allowed but may have limits/guidelines associated 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not all texts are available in this format • Be sure to consult school library for text that they may have available electronically. Many schools offer downloads of commonly used textbooks • Make sure expiration date coincides with class timeline
